

Editorial requirements for submitting material for publication

Journal

Call for paper

<u>What</u>: the journal is published every six months. Each issue focuses on a particular topic, which serves as a veritable *leit motif* linking all the various publications. The topic is initially selected by the editorial team, which is then formalized by a *call for paper* by Prof. Leghissa before receiving final validation from the editors. The *call for paper*, concludes the procedure in order to provide precise indications for all those who intend to submit material.

<u>Who</u>: everyone. The editors reserve the right to invite scholars to contribute with their own material;

<u>When</u>: normally the *call for paper* is released 7 months before the publication of the relevant issue and remains open for a six-month period;

<u>How</u>: articles need to be drafted according to the APA (*American Psychological Association*) international rules and conventions for documenting sources. Detailed instructions on the styles and format to be used can be found under http://www.apastyle.org. Papers should be submitted by the date indicated in the *call for paper*, these should be anonymous and give no indication of the author's identity;

<u>Procedure</u>: once the material has been received, the editors will forward it anonymously to at least two members of the scientific committee selected according to the paper's specific theme or discipline. The scientific committee will provide the members involved with a standard marking template. Should assessment by both members be positive, the article will proceed to publication. Authors will however be informed of assessments, which editors will keep on file.

WEBSITE

Book reviews

<u>What</u>: Book reviews will be published regularly in the website and occasionally in the published issues of the journal. These reviews are short texts that critically present an unpublished academic text considered innovative for its engagement with new issues in the philosophical debate;

Who: all scholars: professors, graduates, phd students, researchers

When: generally there is no deadline; the editorial team will receive and keep a register of all reviews received in order to publish them periodically during the year;

<u>How</u>: the length of the review must be between 250 to 830 words and sent via email to: redazione@philosophykitchen.com;

<u>Procedure</u>: the reviews will be examined by the editorial team, who may refuse publication if they fail to meet the above-mentioned scientific standards or publishing requirements. Texts that are considered particularly relevant may nevertheless be published in the journal

<u>Value</u>: the reviews published online in the website (differently from those included in the journal) will not be subject to ISSN/BN criteria for evaluation. Consequently, as established by prevailing norms for scientific publications, it will not be possible to assign any points to authors.

Columns

<u>What</u>: the website's columns consist of a series of a minimum of four short articles, each structured in a similar way and addressing a common topic, that will be published periodically on the website;

Who: all scholars: professors, graduates, phd students, researchers;

<u>When</u>: the columns will be published periodically over a relatively brief period of time. The editorial team, however, reserves the right to determine the opening and closing date of a particular topic, bearing in mind the authors availability and editorial demands;

<u>How</u>: the editorial team invites all those interested to propose an idea for a column, sending it via email with at least one fully written article, if available, or a draft.

<u>Procedure</u>: once the column has been approved by the editorial team, the author of each column, in agreement with the editorial team, will remain available and responsible for delivering all the necessary material within the agreed deadlines.

Single articles for the website

<u>What</u>: articles considered particularly relevant for their topic and scientific merit, but are not strictly related to the *call for papers*.

Who: all scholars:

<u>Procedure</u>: the editorial team will evaluate the article and may decide to pass it in *blind* review.
