

Norme editoriali a uso dei curatori e degli autori

CRITERI REDAZIONALI GENERALI

Per i criteri generali di impaginazione, struttura e organizzazione del testo fare riferimento al **Template** fornito a tutti gli autori e reperibile alla pagina del call for paper.

In aggiunta si raccomanda di:

- inserire dopo ogni punto a capo un rientro a destra standard (tasto TAB).
- non utilizzare gli elenchi numerati o puntati automatici di Word, ma procedere manualmente.
- non utilizzare tabulazioni.
- per indicare il nome di associazioni usare le virgolette alte e non il corsivo. Per esempio "Ordine Nuovo".
- il nome delle **riviste** inserito nel normale corpo del testo va in corsivo senza virgolette.
- utilizzare la dicitura "Per esempio" evitando abbreviazioni.
- usare l'abbreviazione *ecc. mai etc.*
- gli eventi storici vanno indicati con le iniziali in maiuscolo (per casi particolari si consiglia comunque di riferirsi alla letteratura scientifica già esistente in merito). Per esempio La Restaurazione.
- si raccomanda di limitare il più possibile l'uso delle virgolette di enfasi, eventualmente da sostituire col corsivo.
- nel caso di santi, omettere la dicitura "San" o "Sant". Per esempio Agostino, nel *De trinitate*, afferma che...
dio" sempre minuscolo.

NORME PER LE CITAZIONI NEL TESTO

Per le citazioni e i dati bibliografici, **Philosophy Kitchen utilizza il sistema APA** (American Psychological Association), anche conosciuto come sistema Autore-data.

Il numero delle note va sempre posto dopo la punteggiatura.

Le citazioni più lunghe di 4 righe sono da considerarsi intese e quindi staccate dal corpo del testo seguendo le indicazioni fornite nel Template.

1. Citazione indiretta

In caso di citazione indiretta del pensiero di un autore va citato il cognome dell'autore e l'anno di pubblicazione. Non è necessario citare i numeri di pagina. Si può comunque indicare il numero di pagina con l'aggiunta di "ss." (seguenti).

Es. *Possiamo affermare che il resoconto sia l'unica modalità con cui la propria azione può essere comunicata alla comunità scientifica (Carli 1987).*

Alcune precisazioni:

- Se il cognome dell'autore compare nel testo va aggiunta la sola data tra parentesi immediatamente dopo il cognome dell'autore. Es. *Carli (1987) afferma che il resoconto sia l'unica modalità con cui la propria azione può essere comunicata alla comunità scientifica.*

- Se il cognome dell'autore e la data compaiono in un testo all'interno di parentesi, come nel caso di citazioni all'interno di parentesi o note a piè di pagina, non si apre un'altra parentesi ma si usano le virgole. Es. *(Carli, 1987, afferma che il resoconto sia l'unica modalità con cui la propria azione può essere comunicata alla comunità scientifica).*

- La citazione indiretta può essere preceduta dall'espressione "cfr." (confronta). Es. *Il resoconto è l'unica modalità con cui la propria azione può essere comunicata alla comunità scientifica (cfr. Carli 1987).*

2. Citazione diretta

Il testo citato letteralmente è racchiuso tra virgolette a caporale («»). Nel caso ci siano citazioni interne alle citazioni, utilizzare le virgolette alte con la grazia ("""). Oltre al cognome dell'autore e alla data di pubblicazione si aggiunge anche il numero di pagina o delle pagine da cui è tratto il brano riportato, senza l'abbreviazione "pp.".

Es. *È utile ricordare che «L'evento che costituisce l'oggetto del resoconto è influenzato dall'intervento dell'osservatore; la relazione che di esso viene fatta è quindi riferibile non tanto ad un evento in sé, quanto alle sue modificazioni indotte dall'osservazione stessa» (Carli 1987, 205).*

Alcune precisazioni:

- Il testo deve essere riportato fedelmente e integralmente. Ogni aggiunta va indicata tra parentesi quadre []. Ogni omissione va indicata con tre puntini di sospensione tra parentesi quadra [...]. Es. *È utile ricordare che «L'evento che costituisce l'oggetto del resoconto è influenzato dall'intervento dell'osservatore; la relazione che di esso viene fatta è quindi riferibile [...] alle sue modificazioni indotte dall'osservazione stessa» (Carli 1987, 205).*

- Se in una citazione si enfatizza una parola e si modifica il carattere da tondo a corsivo, bisogna indicare "corsivo mio" (in tondo) dopo il numero di pagina.
- Le pagine in numero romano vanno sempre in minuscolo. Es. *(Carli 1987, x-xi).*
- Nel sistema APA non si usano mai *Ivi* e *Ibidem*.

3. Lavori di due o più autori

Quando gli autori sono due vanno indicati entrambi i cognomi separati da &.

Es. La psicologia clinica è definibile come una prassi che lavora entro l'area emozionale (Carli & Paniccia 2003).

Se gli autori compaiono nel testo come parte del discorso sono uniti dalla congiunzione "e" e seguiti dalla data tra parentesi. *Es. Carli e Paniccia (2003) definiscono la psicologia clinica come una prassi che lavora entro l'area emozionale.*

Quando gli autori sono più di due si cita solo il cognome del primo autore seguito dall'indicazione "et al.".

4. Due o più lavori dello stesso autore

Nel caso di più lavori dello stesso autore si cita il cognome dell'autore seguito dagli anni ordinati cronologicamente. Dopo ogni anno viene inserita una virgola.

Es. Nei lavori dedicati a questo argomento (Carli 1976, 1987, 1989)...

Nel caso di più lavori di diversi autori, ogni lavoro è separato da un punto e virgola. Gli autori vanno ordinati alfabeticamente. *Es. L'argomento è ripreso in altri scritti (Carli 1987; Carli & Paniccia 2003).*

I contributi di uno stesso autore pubblicati nello stesso anno vanno identificati con lettere alfabetiche progressive. *Es. L'argomento è ripreso in altri scritti (Carli 1987a e 1987b).*

5. Fonte di seconda mano

Se si cita un lavoro che è riportato in un altro lavoro si cita soltanto la fonte secondaria mentre la fonte primaria si cita espressamente nel corso del testo.

Es. Come afferma Melanie Klein (citata in Carli 1987, 123), la dinamica edipica...

6. Lavoro in più volumi

Se si cita un libro composto da più volumi, il numero del volume va indicato in numero romano dopo la data di pubblicazione seguita dalla virgola.

Es. Come afferma Husserl nella Prima ricerca logica (1968, I, 342), ...

7. Classici greci e latini

Utilizzare tra parentesi l'abbreviazione dell'opera così come figura nell'elenco in appendice. In nota, alla prima occorrenza, segnalare sempre la traduzione utilizzata, che dovrà poi essere riportata sempre in bibliografia secondo le norme già descritte.

BIBLIOGRAFIE

1. Libri.

1.1. Lo schema di base è il seguente:

Piana, G. (1979). *Elementi di una dottrina dell'esperienza*. Milano: Il Saggiatore.

Alcune precisazioni:

La casa editrice deve essere citata per esteso con le iniziali maiuscole, omettendo le indicazioni societarie e la parola "editore", "publisher" e simili.

Il luogo di edizione va citato in lingua originale. Se vi sono due o più luoghi di edizione, si possono citare tutti separandoli con un trattino o è possibile citare solo il primo.

Spesso le *città statunitensi* sono seguite dall'*abbreviazione dello stato* cui appartengono (ML, NY, VA ecc.), in maiuscolo, per non generare confusione tra città con lo stesso nome. Es. Cambridge, MA: Harvard University Press.

1.2. In caso di due autori, inserire una & tra i due nomi. Es. Dazzi, N. & De Coro, A. (2001). *Psicologia dinamica. Le teorie cliniche*. Roma-Bari: Laterza. Se gli autori sono più di due, indicare solo il primo seguito da "et al." Es. Roeder, K. et al. (1967). *Nerve cells and insect behavior*. Cambridge, MA: Harvard University Press.

1.3. Se si tratta di pubblicazioni a cura di enti, istituti o università, l'ente si cita per intero e sempre per esteso al posto dell'autore. Tra l'ente e la data si mette un punto. University of Minnesota. (1985). *Social Psychology*. Minneapolis, MN: University of Minnesota Press.

1.4. Nel caso in cui si citino contributi tratti da libri "a cura di" o raccolte: se si cita una raccolta nella sua totalità, si considera il curatore come autore, con dicitura "ed." tra parentesi. Tale indicazione precede la data ed è separata da essa da un punto. Higgins, J. (ed.) (1988). *Psychology*. New York: Norton. Se invece si cita un *singolo saggio all'interno di una raccolta*, lo schema è il seguente: Bordi, S. (1995). Il contributo di Selma Fraiberg. In E. Pelando (a cura di), *Modelli di sviluppo in psicoanalisi* (479-495). Milano: Raffaello Cortina.

Se i curatori sono due, sono uniti dalla & senza virgola. Se i curatori sono più di due, si indica solo il primo seguito da "et al."

1.5. Lavoro in corso di stampa: si aggiunge l'espressione "in press" tra parentesi dopo il nome. Es. Boniolo, G. (in press). *Il limite e il ribelle: Etica, naturalismo, darwinismo*. Milano: Raffaello Cortina.

1.6 Citazioni da un dizionario o un'enciclopedia: Es. 1. Sheehy, N. et al. (eds). (1997). *Biographical dictionary of psychology*. London: Routledge. Es. 2. *The American college dictionary*.

(1962). New York: Random House. Nel caso in cui si citi *una singola voce di dizionario o enciclopedia*, se questa è firmata, si segue il seguente schema: Marhaba, S. (1982). Psicoanalisi. In *Enciclopedia Garzanti di filosofia* (740-742). Milano: Garzanti. Se invece la voce non è firmata, il titolo della voce va al posto dell'autore: Psicodinamica. (1982). In *Enciclopedia Garzanti di filosofia* (742). Milano: Garzanti.

1.7. Due o più volumi: il numero romano del volume va racchiuso tra parentesi subito dopo il titolo. Foss, B. M. (ed). (1965). *Determinants of infant behavior* (III). London: Methuen. Se i volumi sono stati *pubblicati in date diverse*, vanno indicate la prima e l'ultima separate da un trattino. Wilson, J. G. & Fraser, F. C. (eds). (1977-1978). *Handbook of teratology* (I-IV). New York: Plenum Press.

2. Riviste e periodici

2.1. Lo schema di base è il seguente:

Musatti, C. L. (1931). Forma e assimilazione. *Archivio Italiano di Psicologia*, 9, 61-156.

2.2. In caso di due autori, tra il primo e il secondo autore si usa la & commerciale. Oltre i due autori si indica solo il primo seguito da "et al." Es. Rodin, J. & Ianis, I. L. (1979). The social power of health-care practitioners as agent of change. *Journal of Social Issues*, 35, 60-81.

2.3 Articolo in rivista con più fascicoli: si indica il numero del volume e il numero del fascicolo tra parentesi. Es. Nicholson, I. A. M. (1997). Humanistic Psychology and intellectual identity: The "open" system of Gordin Allport. *Journal of Humanistic Psychology*, 37 (3), 61-79.

3. Traduzioni

Nel caso in cui si citi da una traduzione italiana di un contributo in altra lingua:

- Se si tratta di un *libro*, si inserisce la dicitura "trad. it." e si indica il nome (iniziale maiuscola) e il cognome del traduttore.

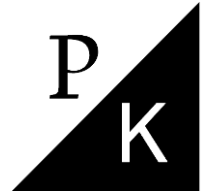

4. Inediti

4.1. *Manoscritti*: si fa seguire al titolo in corsivo l'espressione "Manoscritto Inedito". Beebe, B., & Kronen, J. (1988). *Mutual regulation of affective matching in mother-infant face-to-face play*. Unpublished manuscript.

4.2. *Ricerca inedita*: in tondo e tra parentesi quadre si inserisce la descrizione dei dati, seguita dall'espressione "ricerca inedita". Bianchi, A. (1999). [Validity study on CCRT method]. Unpublished raw data.

4.3. *Tesi di laurea o dottorato inedita*: Es. Parker, J. D. A. (1991). *In search of the person: The*



historical development of American personality psychology. Tesi di dottorato inedita, York University, Toronto, Canada.

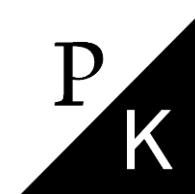
4.4. *Lavoro inedito presentato ad un congresso*: si segue il seguente schema, inserendo l'espressione "lavoro presentato al". Fung H. H. T. (1995, March). *Becoming a moral child. The role of shame in the socialization of young Chinese children*. Paper presented at meeting of the Society for Research in Child Development, Indianapolis, IN.

5. Internet e multimedia

5.1 Lo schema di base relativo alla citazione di un articolo di rivista reperito su un sito web è il seguente: Nicolas, S. (2000). *L'école de la Salpêtrière en 1885*. *Psychologie et Histoire*, 1, 165-207, [http://lpe.psych.univ-paris5.fr/membres/Nicolas\(3\).htm](http://lpe.psych.univ-paris5.fr/membres/Nicolas(3).htm)

5.2 Citazione di un intero sito web: è sufficiente indicarlo tra parentesi all'interno del testo, senza includerlo nella bibliografia finale.

Editorial Norms

for the use of editors and authors

GENERAL EDITORIAL CRITERIA

Please refer to the Template provided to all authors and available on the Call for Papers page for general layout, structure and organization criteria.

In addition, it is recommended to:

- Insert a standard right indent (TAB key) at the beginning of each paragraph.
- Do not use Word's automatic numbered or bulleted lists, but proceed manually.
- Do not use tabulations.
- To indicate the name of associations, use high quotes and not italics. For example, "New Order."
- The name of **journals** inserted in the normal body text goes in italics without quotation marks.
- Use the wording "For example," avoiding abbreviations.
- Historical events and epochs should be indicated with capitalized initials (however, for special cases it is advisable to refer to existing scholarly literature on the subject). For example, "The Enlightenment."
- It is recommended to limit the use of quotation marks to the purpose of emphasis, possibly to be replaced with italics.
- "God" always lowercase.

RULES FOR IN-TEXT QUOTATIONS

For quotations and bibliographic data, **Philosophy Kitchen uses the American Psychological Association (APA) system**, also known as the Author-data system.

The number of notes should always be placed after punctuation.

Quotations longer than 4 lines are not in quotes and detached from the body of the text according to the indications provided in the Template.

1. Indirect quotation

In case of indirect citation of an author's thought, the author's last name and the year of publication should be cited. It is not necessary to cite page numbers. However, the page number may be given with the addition of "ff." (following).

E.g.: We can say that reporting is the only way in which one's action can be communicated to the scientific community (Carli 1987).

Some clarifications:

- If the author's last name appears in the text, the date in brackets should be added immediately after the author's last name. *E.g.: Carli (1987) states that reporting is the only way in which one's action can be communicated to the scientific community.*

- If the author's last name and date appear in a text in brackets, as in the case of quotations within parentheses or footnotes, another parenthesis should not be opened but commas should be used. *E.g.: (Carli, 1987, states that reporting is the only way in which one's action can be communicated to the scientific community).*

- Indirect quotation may be preceded by the expression "cf." (compare). *E.g.: reporting is the only way by which one's action can be communicated to the scientific community (cf. Carli 1987).*

2. Direct quotation

Texts quoted literally are between guillemets («»). In case there are internal quotations within quotations, use high quotation marks (""). In addition to the author's last name and date of publication, add the page number(s) from which the quoted passage is taken, without the abbreviation "pp."

E.g.: It is useful to remember that «The event that constitutes the object of the account is influenced by the intervention of the observer; the report that is made of it is therefore referable not so much to an event in itself as to its modifications induced by the observation itself» (Carli 1987, 205).

Some clarifications:

- The text must be quoted faithfully and in full. Each addition should be indicated in square brackets ([]). Each omission should be indicated with three dots in square brackets ([...]). *E.g.: It is useful to remember that «The event that constitutes the object of the account is influenced by the intervention of the observer; the report that is made of it is therefore referable [...] to its modifications induced by the observation itself» (Carli 1987, 205).*

- If you emphasize a word in a quotation and change the font from rounded to italics, you must indicate "italics mine" (rounded) after the page number.

- Roman numeral pages always go in lower case. *E.g.: (Carli 1987, x-xi).*

- *Ivi* and *Ibid.* are never used in the APA system.

3. Works by two or more authors

When there are two authors both last names separated by “&” should be indicated.

E.g.: Clinical psychology can be defined as a practice that works within the emotional area (Carli & Paniccia 2003).

If the authors appear in the text as part of the discourse they are joined by the conjunction “and” and followed by the date in parentheses. *E.g.: Carli and Paniccia (2003) define clinical psychology as a practice that works within the emotional area.*

When there are more than two authors, only the last name of the first author is cited followed by the indication “et al.”

4. Two or more works by the same author

In the case of more than one work by the same author, the last name of the author is cited followed by the years ordered chronologically. A comma is added after each year.

E.g.: In works devoted to this topic (Carli 1976, 1987, 1989)...

In the case of multiple works by different authors, each work is separated by a semicolon. Authors should be ordered alphabetically. *E.g.: The topic is taken up in other papers (Carli 1987; Carli & Paniccia 2003).*

Contributions by the same author published in the same year should be identified with progressive alphabetical letters. *E.g.: The topic is taken up in other writings (Carli 1987a and 1987b).*

5. Secondary source

If one cites a work that is reported in another work only the secondary source should be cited, while the primary source is explicitly cited throughout the text.

E.g.: As Melanie Klein states (cited in Carli 1987, 123), the Oedipal dynamic...

6. Work in several volumes

When citing a book consisting of several volumes, the volume number should be given in Roman numerals after the date of publication followed by the comma.

E.g.: As Husserl states in The First Logical Quest (1968, I, 342), ...

7. Greek and Latin Classics

Use the abbreviation of the work in brackets as it appears in the list in the appendix. In the footnote, when first occurring, always indicate the translation used, which should then always be given in the bibliography according to the rules already described.

BIBLIOGRAPHIES

1. Books

1.1. The basic outline is as follows:

Piana, G. (1979). Elements of a doctrine of experience. Milan: Il Saggiatore.

Some clarifications:

The publishing house should be quoted in full with capital letters, omitting corporate indications and the word “publisher,” “publisher,” and the like.

The place of publishing should be cited in the original language. If there are two or more places of publishing, they can all be cited by separating them with a hyphen or only the first one can be cited.

Often U.S. cities are followed by the abbreviation of the state to which they belong (ML, NY, VA, etc.), in capitals, so as not to cause confusion between cities with the same name. E.g.: Cambridge, MA: Harvard University Press.

1.2. In case of two authors, insert an “&” between the two names. E.g.: Dazzi, N. & De Coro, A. (2001). Dynamic psychology. Clinical theories. Rome-Bari: Laterza. If there are more than two authors, indicate only the first followed by “et al.” E.g.: Roeder, K. et al. (1967). Nerve cells and insect behavior. Cambridge, MA: Harvard University Press.

1.3. If these are publications by agencies, institutes or universities, the entity is cited in full and always in full instead of the author. A period is placed between the institution and the date. University of Minnesota. (1985). Social Psychology. Minneapolis, MN: University of Minnesota Press.

1.4. In the case of citing contributions from edited books or collections: if citing a collection in its entirety, consider the editor as author, with “ed.” indicated in brackets. This indication precedes the date and is separated from it by a period. E.g.: Higgins, J. (ed.) (1988). Psychology. New York: Norton. If, instead, a single essay is cited from a collection, the pattern is as follows: Bordi, S. (1995). Selma Fraiberg's contribution. In E. Pelando (ed.), Models of development in psychoanalysis (479-495). Milan: Raffaello Cortina.

If there are two editors, they are joined by the “&” without comma. If there are more than two editors, only the first is indicated followed by “et al.”

1.5. Work in press: the phrase “in press” is added in parentheses after the name. E.g.: Boniolo, G. (in press). The limit and the rebel: Ethics, naturalism, Darwinism. Milan: Raffaello Cortina.

1.6 Citations from a dictionary or encyclopedia should be as follows: E.g. (1): Sheehy, N. et

al. (eds). (1997). *Bio-graphical dictionary of psychology*. London: Routledge. E.g. (2): *The American college dictionary* (1962). New York: Random House. When citing *a single dictionary or encyclopedia entry*, if it is signed, the following outline should be followed: Marhaba, S. (1982). *Psychoanalysis*. In *Enciclopedia Garzanti di Filosofia* (740-742). Milan: Garzanti. If, however, the entry is not signed, the title of the entry goes in place of the author: *Psychodynamics*. (1982). In *Enciclopedia Garzanti di Filosofia* (742). Milan: Garzanti.

1.7. Two or more volumes: the Roman numeral of the volume should be in brackets immediately after the title. E.g.: Foss, B. M. (ed). (1965). *Determinants of infant behavior* (III). London: Methuen. If the volumes were published on different dates, the first and last should be indicated separated by a hyphen. E.g.: Wilson, J. G. & Fraser, F. C. (eds). (1977-1978). *Handbook of teratology* (I-IV). New York: Plenum Press.

2. Journals and periodicals

2.1. The basic outline is as follows:

Musatti, C. L. (1931). *Form and assimilation*. *Italian Archives of Psychology*, 9, 61-156.

2.2. In the case of two authors, between the first and second authors the “&” is used. In the case of more than two authors, only the first is indicated followed by “et al.” E.g.: Rodin, J. & Ianis, I. L. (1979). *The social power of health-care practitioners as agents of change*. *Journal of Social Issues*, 35, 60-81.

2.3 For article in journal with multiple files, indicate volume number and file number in brackets. E.g.: Nicholson, I. A. M. (1997). *Humanistic Psychology and intellectual identity: The “open” system of Gordin Allport*. *Journal of Humanistic Psychology*, 37 (3), 61-79.

3. Translations

In the case of quoting from an Italian translation of a contribution in another language:

- If it is a book, insert “trad. it.” and give the translator’s first name (with capital letter) and last name.

Bernet, R. et al. (1992). *Edmund Husserl*. Transl. it. C. La Rocca. Bologna: Il Mulino.

4. Unpublished

4.1 In the case of manuscripts, italicized title is followed by the phrase “Unpublished Manuscript.” E.g.: Beebe, B., & Kronen, J. (1988). *Mutual regulation of affective matching in mother-infant face-to-face play*. Unpublished manuscript.

4.2. In the case of unpublished research, insert the description of the data rounded in square brackets, followed by the phrase “unpublished research.” E.g.: Bianchi, A. (1999). [Validity study



on CCRT method]. Unpublished raw data.

4.3. In the case of unpublished graduate or doctoral thesis, the outline is as follows: Parker, J. D. A. (1991). In search of the person: The historical development of American personality psychology. Unpublished doctoral dissertation, York University, Toronto, Canada.

4.4. In the case of unpublished work presented at a conference, the outline is as follows: Fung H. H. T. (1995, March). Becoming a moral child. The role of shame in the socialization of young Chinese children. Paper presented at meeting of the Society for Research in Child Development, Indianapolis, IN.

5. Internet and multimedia

5.1 The basic outline regarding the quotations of a journal article found on a website is as follows: Nicolas, S. (2000). L'école de la Salpêtrière en 1885. *Psychologie et Histoire*, 1, 165-207, [http://lpe.psycho.univ-paris5.fr/membres/Nicolas\(3\).htm](http://lpe.psycho.univ-paris5.fr/membres/Nicolas(3).htm)

5.2 Citation of an entire website: simply indicate it in brackets within the text, without including it in the final bibliography.
